## A collage of writing and artistic expression on a single topic which utilizes multiple genres to convey its message.

Each student will complete the following:

- 1. Cover Page—A creative title, author's name, the date, and a graphic (picture)
- 2. Table of Contents—listing the title and page number for each piece
- 3. Purpose Paragraph—Please plan to re-do if there were any mistakes
- 4. Genre #1 **Informational Essay**—required. (Rough draft is due on September 13 and will be graded using the 6 Traits Rubric )
- 5. Genre #2—your choice
- 6. Genre #3—your choice
- 7. Genre #4—your choice
- 8. Genre #5—your choice
- 9. Genre #6—your choice
- 10. Genre #7—your choice
- 11. Works Cited/Bibliography—this is where you list sources you used to find information about your topic. I will give you the correct format to use.
  - One genre must be an informative essay on your topic of at least 400 words in length
  - No genre may be used more than once except poetry, which may be used twice (as long as the poems are different forms).
  - Do not plagiarize your work. Write in your own words—no copying from the Internet or other sources. If you are caught doing this, you will receive no credit for that piece of the project.
  - Genres that are not well crafted will be scored half credit.
  - Spell check and proofread! Have another person help you if this isn't your strength. I will deduct 1 point for each mistake.
  - You are expected to work on this project during class time and if needed, <u>homework</u>.
