## What is Response to Intervention?

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- ***Multi-tiered system*** of intervention for All Students
- ***A systematic*** application of ***data-based*** decision making to enhance outcomes for ***ALL students***
- Data collection system, and assessment that informs decision making, and ongoing progress monitoring of students

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**RTI**

is not

**Special Education!**

## However...

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RtI has been explored as a primary way to identify students with a specific learning disability

RTI is a process used to meet the requirements of Article 7's Early Intervening Services

Article 7 is Indiana's legal implementation of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2004

## 4 Key Elements of Response To Intervention

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1. High-quality, **research-based instruction** matched to student needs
2. **Monitoring** student learning over a period of time to determine their level and rate of performance on assessment for constant decision-making
3. Provide **interventions** of increasing intensity
4. Make important educational **decisions** based on data



There are 3 types of RTI....

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1. Standard Treatment
2. Problem - Solving Approach
3. Pre-Referral Approach

## 1. Standard Treatment

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This type of RTI is the most popular. It addresses the curriculum within a classroom as a whole. It uses research-based measurements to provide remediation to a class as a whole.

## 2. Problem - Solving Approach

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This approach is often used when a school does not have an RTI system in place. This approach is gathering data about one individual student who is falling behind in a certain area, and giving that student remediation. This approach does not involve the whole class.

### 3. Pre-Referral Approach

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This approach is the least common, and is not truly RTI in its intended form. This approach takes a student who may be struggling in an area, and begins the pre-referral process for special education. There are no prior interventions to see if the student did have a response.

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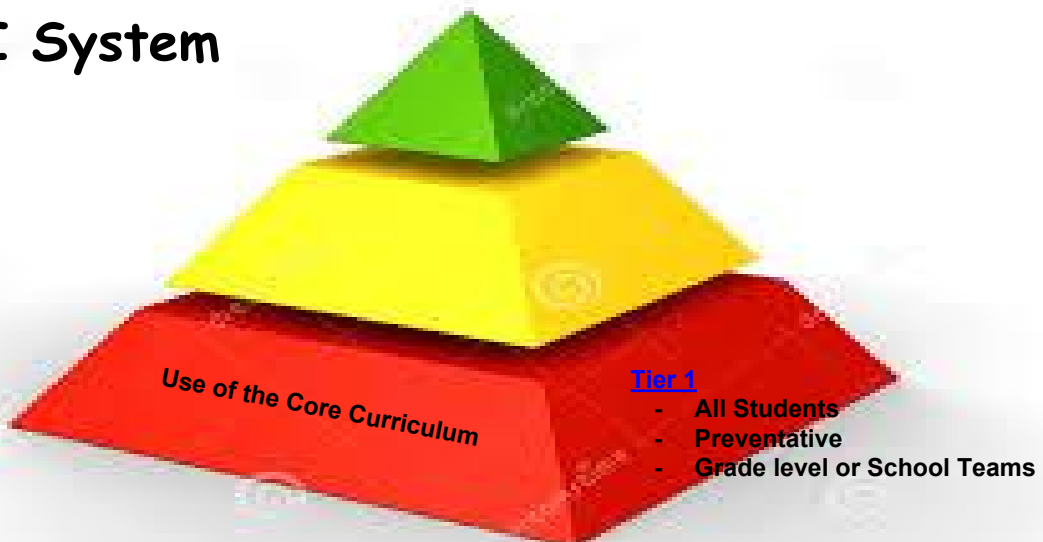

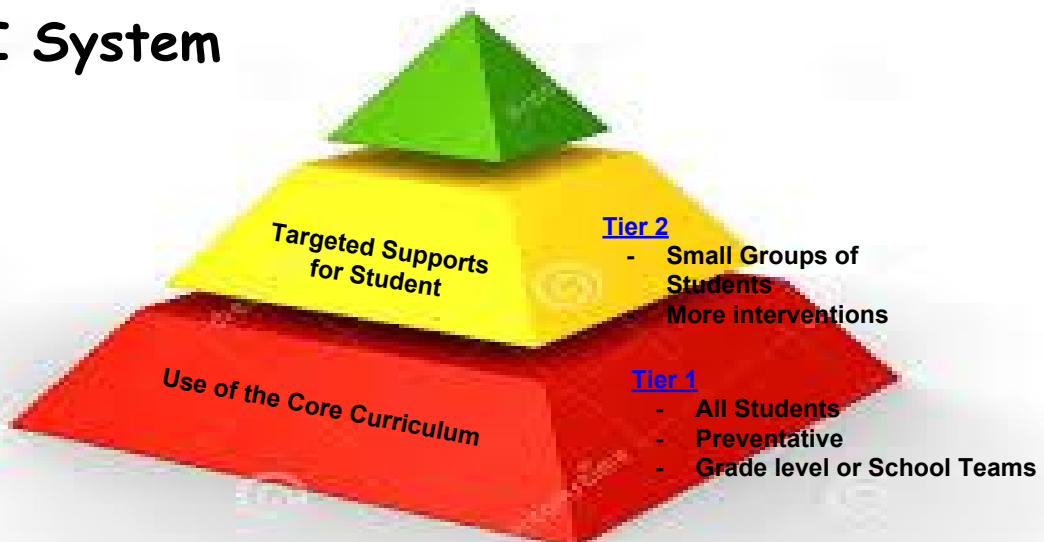
Whole School, or Whole Grade Levels

Examples:

- Attendance Programs
- Reading Programs
- Positive Behavior Support Plans

# RTI System

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## Tier Two

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15%

Small Groups

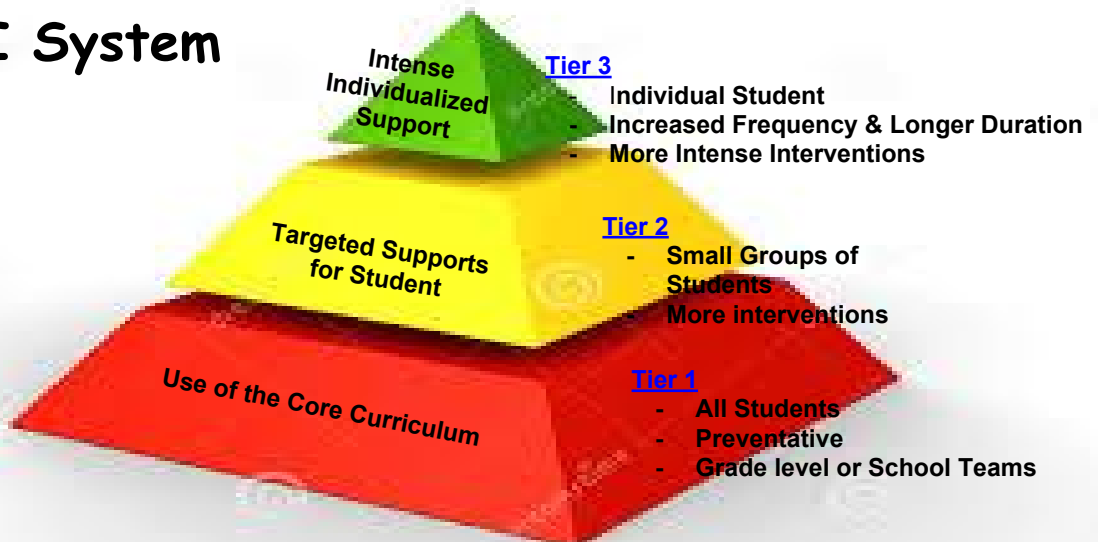
- Skill Level

Examples:

- Mentoring
- Small Group Practice in subject area
- Anger Control Programs

## RTI System

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## Tier Three

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5%

Individualized

No Response = Referral to Special Education

Examples

- One on One tutoring
- One on One Behavior Counseling
- Intense Interventions

## All Three Tiers Must Have...

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### •Curricula, Instruction, and Intervention

- Evidence-based
- Culturally responsive
- Consistent and high quality

### •Assessment and Progress Monitoring

- Tools meet necessary measurement criteria, such as sensitivity to change



## Roles and Implications

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General Education Teacher

- Must provide effective education throughout

Special Education Teacher

- Provide Advice for Interventions and be prepared for referrals

Training and Education!

# RTI Team

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- Each school wishing to use RTI, must have a designated RTI team.
- The RTI team has many jobs and many rolls...
  - Guide Teachers
  - Guide Program
  - Communicate with Parents
  - Collect and Manage Data

# RTI Team cont..

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Roles:

- Facilitator - guide and run the meeting, must have working knowledge of the RTI process.
- Recorder - Keeps track of meeting minutes
- Timekeeper - meetings can hold a lot of information, this person needs to keep the team on task and watch the time.

## RTI Team cont..

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### Roles:

Case Manager - supports and guides the teacher who is referring a student or class to RTI.

Coordinator - runs the day to day operations for the team. Monitors RTI data that is being gathered, helps teachers daily, keeps track of students.

## Bottom Line

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- RTI is for all Students
- It is not Special Education, but can be used to determine if a student has a specific learning disability
  - RTI can be used in any school and any district
    - There are three tiers
- There must be an RTI team
