



- Tier 1
 - Give direct instruction
 - Provide feedback
 - State the goal or objective
- Tier 2
 - Pinpoint what student needs
 - Provide students with more opportunities for practice

Strategies for Implementing 3 Tiers

- Tier 3
 - Instruction based on learning styles
 - Small group
 - Teacher act as a model

Keys to Success of Implementation

- Choose and implement interventions
- Monitor student's progress
 - Curriculum
 - Intervention
- Determine intensity of support that student needs
