Effective Teaching Practices: Content-Specific Segments & Focused Teacher Reflection

<u>Jessica E. Ulrich</u> participated in a professional development session focused on a model to ensure quality teaching that balances the necessity of research-based data with the equally vital need to understand the strengths and weaknesses of individual students.

With a focus on effective teaching practices, including content specific segments and focused teacher reflection, participants met the following outcomes:

- Focused on specific strategies of the Marzano instructional framework that refer to constructing content-area segments that maximize learning for students.
- Acquired strategies for delivering new content and practiced them to deepen understanding.
- Discovered the importance of applying knowledge by generating and testing hypotheses.
- Learned how to coach teachers and pre-service teachers to effectively use these strategies during instruction.
- Developed own skills for providing feedback for growth around these strategies.
