Resolution: the act of finding an answer or solution to a conflict.

Point of View: a particular attitude or way of considering a matter

<u>Perspective</u>: a particular attitude toward or way of regarding something; a point of view

Consensus: general agreement, everyone agrees

<u>Ultimatum</u>: a final threat: a promise that force or punishment will be used if someone does not do what is wanted

Mutual Agreement: the act of agreeing or of coming to a same arrangement

<u>Cooperation:</u> an act or instance of working or acting together for a common purpose or benefit; joint action

Alternative: available as another possibility

<u>Resentment:</u> a feeling of anger or displeasure about someone or something unfair

Dispute: to argue about (something)

#### talking to a brick wall:

Example: I want to resolve this problem but I have dug myself into a hole now and I don't know how to get out of it.

## dig in (one's) heels:

- To resist opposition stubbornly
- · refuse to yield or compromise

Example: I had to dig my heels in when Stacy told me she wasn't going to the mall after she had already promised to come with me.

#### Easier said than done:

- · less difficult to talk about than to do
- you can talk about it, but actual getting up and doing the action is harder than one may think.

Example: I know that I need to resolve things with Bill but it is easier said than done.

#### **Gloves are off:**

• Used when there are signs that a fight is about to start

Example: Both political candidates are out of their seats after that heated argument. The gloves are off!

#### Up in arms:

- very angry with someone
- totally disagree to the point of "war"
- If you are up in arms about something, you are very angry.

Example: The people of Muncie were up in arms over the demolition of the old theatre.

## **Bury the hatchet:**

make peace with someone and stop arguing or fighting.

Example: We buried the hatchet after I told Bob I was sorry for breaking his video game.

### **Dodge the bullet:**

• to successfully avoided a very serious problem

not an actual bullet\*\*

Example: I dodged a bullet when avoiding my ex boyfriend in the mall.

#### **Drop a bombshell:**

 To announce something that changes a situation drastically and unexpectedly

Example: She dropped a bombshell when she told her mother she was pregnant.

#### A Loose cannon:

• A person who is very difficult to control and unpredictable is a loose cannon.
