**Superstition:** a belief or way of behaving that is based on fear of the unknown and faith in magic or luck: a belief that certain events or things will bring good or bad luck

Charm: something that is believed to have magic powers and especially to

prevent bad luck

Misfortune: bad luck

Belief: a feeling of being sure that someone or something exists or that

something is true

Folklore: traditional customs, beliefs, stories, and sayings

**Jinx**: someone or something that causes bad luck

Omen: something that is believed to be a sign or warning of something that

will happen in the future

**Luck:** he things that happen to a person because of chance : the accidental way things happen without being planned

**Magic:** a power that allows people (such as witches and wizards) to do impossible things by saying special words or performing special actions **Gullible:** easily fooled or cheated; *especially*: quick to believe something

that is not true
