Featured Event: Visiting Lecture

For the past decade, our department has been connected with two Universities in Kenya (Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology; MMUST) and Moi University. In the Fall of 2017, we were honored to host a visiting team from MMUST, including the Vice Chancellor and the Dean of Education. This partnership has led to several tremendous collaborative activities that benefit Department as well as the Universities and local communities in Kenya. While many faculty members and administrators have been instrumental in this partnership, Professor Winnie Mucherah has been our leader and primary advocate in this initiative.

Most recently, Dr. Mucherah was awarded the Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship to spend this past summer in Western Kenya working with faculty from MMUST to establish a center devoted to community outreach about Sickle Cell Disease in Kakamega, Kenya. This summer, the Ball State and MMUST team provided informational sessions for nurses, nursing students, and families of children with sickle cell in the community. The goal of this effort is to promote the ability for health care providers and community members to be more aware of the

signs of Sickle Cell Disease, ensuring that children will be more likely to receive treatment and manage their illness in a way that helps them thrive in their educational settings and daily lives.



In addition to this transformative initiative, Dr. Mucherah was a keynote speaker at the first Pan African International Conference on Knowledge Generation and Dissemination (PAIRC) held in Kisumu, Kenya. Her presentation was focused on promoting sustainable development by enhancing global research proficiency and competence.

Alumni Update: NASP Lifetime Achievement

We were pleased to hear that Dr. George Batsche, a graduate of the School Psychology doctoral program was awarded the National Associate of School Psychologists Lifetime Achievement Award at their annual conference this spring. Dr. Batsche is Professor of School Psychology and the co-director of the Institute for Reform at the University of South Florida. The honor was bestowed in recognition of his influential work in the areas of multi-tiered systems of support and response to intervention. He is prolific in both publishing and grantsmanship – regularly funding large scale grants to support services in schools.

Awards and Accomplishments

Sharon Paulson 2018 Ball State University Outstanding Faculty Award



Dr. Paulson's contributions to the University and the fields of Developmental and Educational Psychology were recognized this year as she was awarded the University's

highest faculty honor. As the only faculty member to every receive all three Teachers College Faculty Awards (Outstanding Research, 2014; Outstanding Teaching, 1995; Outstanding Service, 2016), Sharon has demonstrated her remarkable contributions in all aspects of professional life. Her career accomplishments are extensive – but the most recent contribution has been the publication of two textbooks focused on Developmental Psychology readings that support future teachers in recognizing the impact of child and adolescent development in educational settings. As part of this award, Sharon will have the honor of serving as the Summer 2019 Commencement Speaker.

Maria Hernandez-Finch 2018 Ball State University Outstanding Diversity Advocate

Dr. Hernández Finch's professional leadership has impacted diversity awareness and inclusion at the university, community, state, and national levels. Locally, she was twice awarded the *Recognition of*



Diversity Research (2015, 2017) from BSU Office of Institutional Diversity and is currently serving on the OID Diversity Advisory committee. At the national level, Maria is serving as co-chair of the NASP Social Justice Interest Group in the National Association of School Psychologists. In addition to these formal roles, her research consistently explores diversity topics, identifying optimal strategies for equitable assessment and educational access. She also has been instrumental in the Social Justice Book Club – raising the attention of University faculty, staff, and students to topics of social justice.
