- 2. Manage, monitor and interpret assessment data.
- 3. Use assessment evidence to plan and serve instruction.
- 4. Engage learners in their own understanding of their growth and development.

Things you will do or make in EDPS 345:

- Design various assessment instruments, including tests, rubrics, and tools for task analyses.
- Gain experience with data analysis tools and methods (including survey systems and spreadsheets).
- Design assessment-informed units of instruction (to prepare for edTPA and your career).
- Build online learning modules or online complements to face-to-face instruction.
